Letter From Bob

We hope you receive this newsletter by Easter and we pray that your celebration of the resurrection of our Lord will be meaningful to you, your family and your local church. We pray that He will be glorified in all of our lives.

Recently the Lord has allowed me to see the connections in the past that have brought me to the worldwide internet ministry that BLI has today. I want to share this with you.

Several years ago when I was still teaching at East Texas Baptist University I received an email from Logos (Bible Software Company). My New Testament

commentaries are included in their system. Bill Bright, founder of Campus Crusade for Christ, had contacted Logos and wanted to produce a CD-Rom of their training materials to give away to pastors worldwide, to be translated into 50 languages. They wanted to translate all of my commentaries and include them on the CD-Rom. I quickly and excitedly gave permission to do so. Because I have never sold my commentaries to a publisher I retain full rights to them (so that I can give them away).



Not long after this I was teaching at the Emmaus OMS Seminary in Cap-Haitian, Haiti. I went to a local church on Sunday morning and as the pastor preached God spoke to my heart, "Go home and give all your Bible studies away, free to the world." I was not really surprised by this because for many years in my overseas travels it had become obvious to me that many countries have no Bible study materials in their languages. When they are available the cost is about four times as much as in the USA. So, this had been a desire of mine for a long time.

However, I had never made the mental connection between these two experiences until I heard that Bill Bright had gone to be with the Lord without completing the CD-Rom project. I wondered to myself, "Why would God open this door, just to close it?" Well, obviously both of these events prepared me to be open to the internet and CD-Rom ministry that BLI is doing today!!!

The Lord works in mysterious ways which may seem strange to us but He is in control and we trust Him to accomplish His will. What an awesome, mighty, wonderful God we serve!!!

Translations

Slowly, but surely, the number of languages that have been translated is growing. The opportunities often open in miraculous ways. Here is a list of what we currently have online:

- Bengali - Matthew
- Chinese - John, I, II, II John and coming soon, Deuteronomy and Acts
- French - Romans, I, II, III John and 9 more volumes coming soon
- Hungarian - John, coming soon are I, II Timothy and Titus
- Portuguese - Romans and possibly more soon
- Russian - Matthew, Romans and coming soon, John and Acts
- Serbian - John, I & II Corinthians, Prison Letters, I, II, II John and Revelation
- Slovakian - Romans, Revelation (John and Romans currently on radio programs in Slovakia)
- Spanish - Matthew, Romans, I Corinthians and soon, Acts, II Corinthians
- Telugu (India) - John, I, II, II, John and Romans
- Turkish - John, I, II, II John
- Urdu (Pakistan and India) - Deut., John, I, II, II John, Romans, I & II Corinthians, Galatians, I & II Thessalonians, Prison Letters, James, Jude, Revelation
- Punjabi (India) - John, I, II, II John, and Romans
- Vietnamese - Romans and soon, Acts

The following are coming this year:

- Arabic - John, I, II, III John and possibly Romans

- Botswana - Prison Letters in a local tribal language

Open Doors

God has opened so many doors! The Baptist World Alliance (whose next meeting will be in Honolulu in 2010) is going to include the Computer Bible Commentary CD-Rom in every participant's packet. They said they are expecting 15,000 attendees! We are going to produce a new CD with all of the new translations for this project.

We recently sent 7000 of the CD-Roms to a mission organization (Sovereign World Trust) in Kent, England. They give resources to pastors/leaders around the world and include our CD-Rom. We sent 13,000 to ETBU graduates/attendees this year. We send hundreds a month free through our website (www.freebiblecommentary.org).

Please pray for us. The economic times in the US look rough. But, doors still open. We give everything away free but that does not mean it does not cost. Some of the costs involved are:

- paying the translators
- producing the actual CD-Rom
- postage to mail them

We need your help and prayers to walk through these open doors of "Great Commission" opportunities! We know that our God is in control and that He is working all things together to spread His word around the world so that people may be saved and that they may grow in Christ.



Dear Dr. Utley,

You have unearthed for me a most neglected aspect of Bible Study – observing what the text says and allowing it to speak for itself. I have come to agree with your conclusions on the matter of truth (The Word of God) being obtainable and verifiable.

I have been a Pentecostal Christian since May 15, 1995 and my approach to Biblical interpretation has almost always been 'allegorical.' However, ever since I stumbled on your videos and writings I have become something of a skeptic – well, in a positive sense. I no longer give credence to preachers, be they Pentecostal, Charismatic or not who read their own meaning into the Bible or spiritualize a portion of scripture.

Establishing 'Context' has become paramount to me in my reading of the Bible, as I read paragraphs, chapters and books instead of creating a foundation for interpretation based on a 'single' word meaning and a 'single' sentence in paragraph, chapter or entire book of the Bible.
